RETURN SURVEY - OUTCOMES.

Thank you to all the employers who provided feedback through our recent survey to obtain your opinions regarding a number of proposed changes to the Monthly Return Process and information required to be provided. Approximately 30 percent of all employers responded to the survey and provided comments.

The 'proposal' was developed based on issues raised by employers, over time, and areas of concern indentified by TasBuild's Staff.

The proposal was drafted based on the above and sought to address most areas of concern that had been expressed.

It appears that in an effort to address the needs of many differing concerns the feedback indicates that the changes would not decrease your workload, which was one of the key reasons for suggesting the changes.

A large number of employers expressed their support for 'no changes' to the current system

and were quite happy to continue on the current basis.

As indicated in the 'Proposal' outline which was sent to employers it was suggested that should we move to quarterly lodgements there may be increased difficulty in collecting the information to be reported. Based on the response provided, it appears that you agreed as there was strong support to continue to report on a monthly basis.

Despite all of the above there appears to be a high level of support to make some changes, albeit 'fine tuning' of the Return process. We will review the suggestions made and we are likely to introduce incremental, but important changes, during the next quarter which should ease a number of the current issues related to Returns.

We will keep you updated with these changes as they occur.
